



RULES & GUIDELINES Jeunes Artistes | 2015 - 2016

1. All provincial entries must be digital video and submitted through this website starting January 15, 2016. The deadline for submission is 5:00pm (PST) on February 9, 2016.
2. Each entry must be in only ONE category:
 1. Storytelling
 2. Spoken Word Poetry
 3. Singer-Songwriter
 4. Dramatic Reading
 5. Ghost Writer
 6. Documentary Filmmaker
3. Students may work together in groups or submit entries as individuals. If you are applying as a group, select only **ONE** student as main point of contact. A maximum of 5 participants per group is allowed.
4. All entries must be uploaded on Youtube and **mark as unlisted** prior to applying.
5. The video length should not exceed 5 minutes and should include the following information at the END of your presentation (verbal or written):
 - Student(s) Name(s)
 - Title of video
 - Category selected
 - French Program (Core, French Immersion, Francophone)
6. **Each video content must be 50% in French, 50% in English.** With that said, we understand that sometimes it's hard to split down the middle, and will allow up to 15% flexibility.
7. There is an entry fee of \$10, which you can pay by credit card once you have completed the online video entry application form.
8. Each student can only submit **ONE** video entry in **ONE** category.
9. Each entry must focus on **ONE** single topic of the student's choice.
10. The final presentation must be the work completed by the student, rather than a professional organization. Adults/Teachers/Organizers are there to assist with the process and production, but are limited to guidance only.
11. Prizes for the Provincial competition will be announced early 2016. Also, a draw will be conducted from all participating classes (including grade K - 9). It is the teacher's responsibility to register its class online to have a chance to win.
12. By accepting the prizes, winners agree to hold Canadian Parents for French - BC & Yukon and all Canadian Parents for French - BC & Yukon employees harmless against any and all claims and liability arising out of use of such prizes. Winner assumes all liability for any injury or damage caused from participation in the contest or use/redemption of any prize.
13. Students should keep at least one copy of their video. Canadian Parents for French - BC & Yukon is not responsible for any films that are lost, damaged, or that do not upload properly.
14. If chosen as a finalist, you must submit a signed Parent Permission Form before your participation to the provincial competition. The form will be available via email for those who are selected.
15. A student must clearly indicate when the work is original (i.e. written by the student) or an existing work (i.e. previously published or written by another author).
16. Students are responsible to ensure copyright laws are followed when using existing material.
